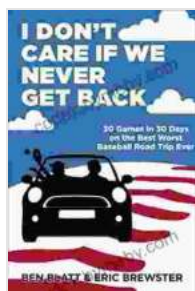


30 Games in 30 Days on the Best Worst Baseball Road Trip Ever

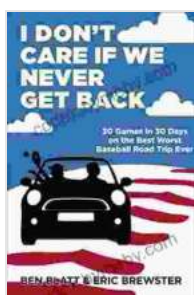
