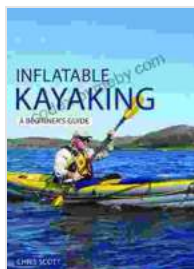

**10 - Strong introduction**

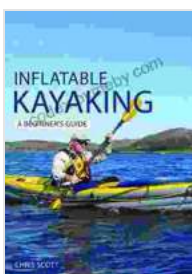
Back to basics. Your introductory paragraph sets the stage for your story. It is your first and perhaps only opportunity to engage your readers' attention.
