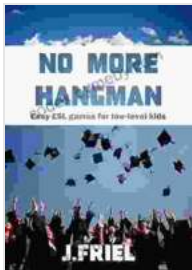

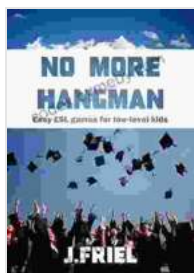

22. **Charades with a Twist:** Instead of acting out a word, students can act out a sentence. This helps them practice their grammar skills.

23. **Pictionary with a Twist:** Instead of drawing a picture, students can draw a word. This helps them practice their spelling and writing skills.
24. **Bingo with a Twist:** Instead of calling out numbers, call out vocabulary words. Students must cover the squares on their bingo cards with the corresponding words.
25. **Memory with a Twist:** Instead of using pictures, use vocabulary words. Students must match the words to find the pairs.
26. **Go Fish with a Twist:** Instead of asking for cards with a



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
