HOW TO WRITE A HISTORY BOOK REVIEW

In a history book review students identify and discuss the author's main points and place the book within its historical context. It is not a literary review nor is it a summary of the book's content nor is it a chapter-by-chapter summary. It is an analysis.

A good review consists of several parts: 1) a thesis statement in which you identify the author's main points; 2) his argument or thesis; and set the book into its historical context; 3) subsequent paragraphs with quotes from the book that elaborate on, and support, each of the thesis points; and 4) a critical analysis of the book. You will also include footnotes and a bibliography (Chicago style only).

Helpful hints:

1) Read the book twice. Once you've read it through the first time, identify the main points. Then read it again, keeping in mind those points, and make note of the pages that contain quotes you wish to use to support your points. If you are reading a novel such as *Jehany Got His Gun*, you'll need to patiently read the book - by the end Dalton Trumbo's message should be clear.

2) As you read, watch out for the author's bias, or ask yourself, "Where is the author coming from?" All authors (as humans) may present more balanced views than others, but they all have biases. For example, if an author is writing from a Marxist perspective, there may be numerous references in his/her work to imperialism and the bourgeoisie. Use the Internet to look up information on the author.

3) Prepare a draft of your essay. Look it over; check for sentence clarity, and spelling or grammatical errors. Is your thesis statement clear? Does it have several points that you elaborate on in part 2 of the review? Do your subsequent paragraphs have topic sentences that link back to a point in the author's thesis? Do the quotes you chose support the points you are making in each of your paragraphs?

4) Make your revisions and re-read the paper. Read it out loud. Does it make sense?

5) Prepare your final paper. Check your work for clarity, and omit any errors in spelling, grammar and sentence structure. Read it aloud again and make any final changes before you submit it. Please do not assume I will understand your content just because I've read the book. Remember, your assignments reflect your knowledge so be sure to clearly convey that knowledge to me.

Plagiarism will result in a failing grade. Please refer to the college's academic conduct policy on the Camosun website (address on your outline). It is quite normal in history reviews to do several drafts of the paper before getting it right.

If you have any questions or need assistance, please see the instructor one week before the assignment is due.

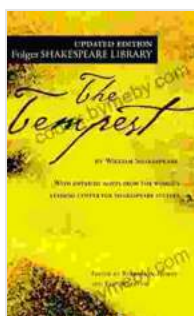
