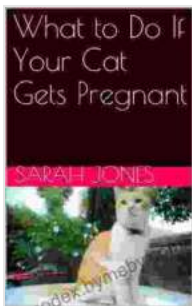


What to Do If Your Cat Gets Pregnant

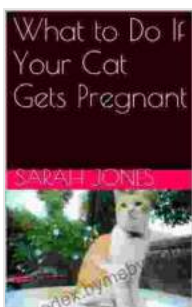
